HOUSE GOP'S IRAN BILL WOULD KILL THE NUCLEAR DEAL

House Republicans, led by Reps Liz Cheney and Peter Roskam, introduced a bill this week to address Donald Trump's desire to "fix" the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action, as the Iran nuclear deal is formally known.

Trump said last week he would kill the deal at the next sanctions waiver deadline in four months' time if Congress doesn't come up with some kind of plan to unilaterally amend the accord.

(REMEMBER: The JCPOA is a multilateral agreement. The U.S. cannot unilaterally make changes.,If the U.S. tries to do so, the deal will collapse, and the U.S. will be responsible for killing it.)

The House legislation will [reportedly](#) reimpose nuclear sanctions if Iran 1) moves forward with work on missiles capable of carrying a nuclear weapon; 2) is in a position to build a nuclear bomb in under 12 months; and 3) refuses to allow inspectors so-called "anytime, anywhere" access.

TO BE CLEAR: This bill will kill the Iran nuclear deal.

- The JCPOA is meant to address Iran's nuclear program only, not its missiles. Without a nuclear weapon, Iran doesn't have nuclear-tipped missiles.
- The timeline within which Iran can theoretically build a nuke shrinks to under 12 months in the out years of the deal. HOWEVER: Iran's commitment never to build a bomb, and to submit to rigorous inspections to monitor that promise, **last in perpetuity.**
- Inspectors already have access to whatever sites they feel they need to monitor.

FURTHER MESSAGING POINTS:

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- **The Iran deal doesn't need to be fixed:** The International Atomic Energy Agency says that Iran is complying with the JCPOA, which is currently working to block all of Iran's pathways to a bomb.
- Trump and the Republicans want to kill the deal and put the U.S. on a path to war with Iran.
- At the same time, other Trump officials — like Secretary Mattis and Tillerson — support the Iran deal and are urging Trump to uphold it.
- American and Israeli experts and security officials support the Iran deal and say it **makes war less likely.**
