TRUMP TO WORLD: IF WE BOMB YOU, WE BAN YOU

Instead of providing a check on Donald Trump's most dangerous and bigoted impulses, the Supreme Court voted to uphold the Muslim Ban this week – shamelessly endorsing discrimination against Muslims and handing the president a blank check for more hate and cruelty.

The Supreme Court's ruling comes on the heels of an expected decision by the Trump administration next week on whether to terminate or extend and/or redesignate <u>Temporary</u> <u>Protected Status (TPS) for Yemen</u> -- which allows Yemeni nationals fleeing their country's war and horrific humanitarian crisis to temporarily remain in the United States. <u>http://thehill.com/policy/defense/394145-former-officials-advocacy-groups-urge-trump-administra</u> <u>tion-to-extend-protected</u>

Yemen is one of the countries <u>named in the Muslim Ban</u>, and alongside this cruel policy – plus the barricades preventing Yemenis from entering the U.S. as refugees or receiving asylum – revoking TPS for Yemen would be tantamount to a death sentence as there is almost **no other pathway for those fleeing Yemen's war to seek refuge in the United States.** <u>https://www.pri.org/stories/2018-06-27/i-lost-trust-system-says-us-citizen-who-struggling-reunite-his-yemeni-family</u>

For over three years, the U.S. has been fueling the world's largest humanitarian crisis by supporting the Saudi Arabia-led coalition's brutal war in Yemen and blocking meaningful pathways to humanitarian and refugee relief. Secretary of State Pompeo <u>sought this week</u> to lay the blame on Iran and wash his hands of any U.S. complicity in Yemen's suffering. If the Trump administration next week chooses to terminate TPS for Yemen, it will make nearly 1,200 Yemeni nationals vulnerable to deportation.

THE PENTAGON'S PAYDAYS KEEP ON COMIN'

This week, the House voted overwhelmingly for a massive \$674.6 billion defense spending bill for fiscal year 2019, an increase of \$20 billion over last year's level. Plain and simple: Pentagon

spending is out of control and hurts our national security. Unfortunately, just <u>49</u> out of the 408 Representatives who voted on the bill agree (19 Reps. did not vote). <u>http://clerk.house.gov/evs/2018/roll313.xml#N</u>

These spending bills matter. A lot. They're not just numbers on a page, they signify our values. And they're telling us that America values spending on endless wars, nuclear weapons, fighter jets, aircraft carriers, and research on ever-more lethal ways to kill people more than it does diplomacy, education, affordable housing, and the environment, and much more. Even America's unaccountable war chest, known in budgetary language as overseas contingency operations, gets more money than the State Department. In fact, if OCO were a federal agency, it would be the <u>fourth largest</u>, behind the Departments of Defense, Veterans Affairs, and Health and Human Services.

What this bill says about our values and what Americans actually value are two different things. In February 2018, a Gallup <u>poll</u> found that **65 percent of Americans believe the United States should not spend more money on defense** and over a third believe we already spend too much.

So why are we spending more and more? **We cannot ignore the influence of the military-industrial-congressional complex**, whereby Congressmembers' campaign coffers are stuffed with contractor contributions and those contractors are rewarded handsomely. Just one example in this year's bill was the 16 additional <u>F-35</u> joint strike fighters added above the DoD's request by defense appropriations chairwoman, Kay Granger. <u>Lockheed's F-35 assembly</u> <u>plant</u> is in Granger's Texas district.

You might hear from congressional party leaders that the spending bill adheres to the budget caps set for FY19. But that's not telling us much. The agreement struck by Republicans and Democrats raised the Pentagon's budget to egregiously high levels, especially given that the Pentagon cannot pass an audit and the ever-present evidence of waste, fraud, and abuse.

Some highlights from this week's consideration:
