

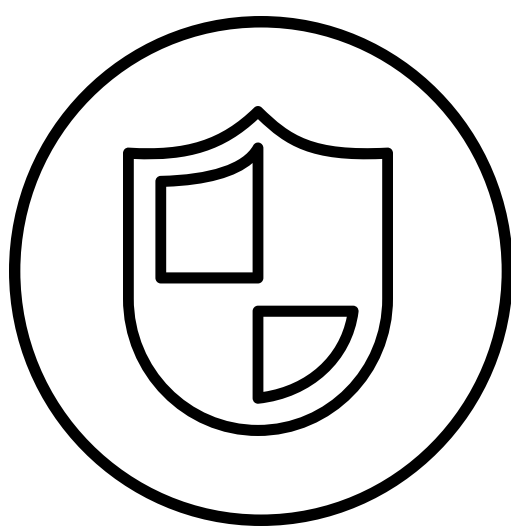

ON THE ISSUES

ENDING ENDLESS WAR



- ✓ Co-sponsored [H.R. 2456](#), to immediately repeal the 2002 AUMF and voted for amendment to [repeal](#) the 2002 AUMF.
- ✓ Supported an amendment to [eliminate](#) indefinite military detention of any person detained under AUMF authority in the U.S., its territories, or its possessions.
- ✓ Voted for an amendment to [express](#) the Sense of the Congress that the 2001 AUMF has been overused, should include a sunset clause, and must define targets in its reauthorization or replacement.
- ✗ Supported the [reauthorization](#) of the USA FREEDOM Act.
- ✗ While he voted to [end](#) U.S. military assistance to the Saudi-led coalition’s intervention in Yemen, he voted for a [carve-out](#) for certain types of support, including intelligence-sharing and targeting assistance.
- ✓ Voted for [S.J.Res. 68](#), to prohibit unauthorized military force against Iran.
- ✓ Voted on an [amendment](#) to withdraw all U.S. forces and military personnel from Afghanistan by February 2021.
- ✗ Is not a cosponsor of [H.R. 1274](#), to sunset the 2001 AUMF within eight months.
- ✗ Voted for the [2002 AUMF](#), to authorize the U.S. invasion of Iraq.

PENTAGON SPENDING



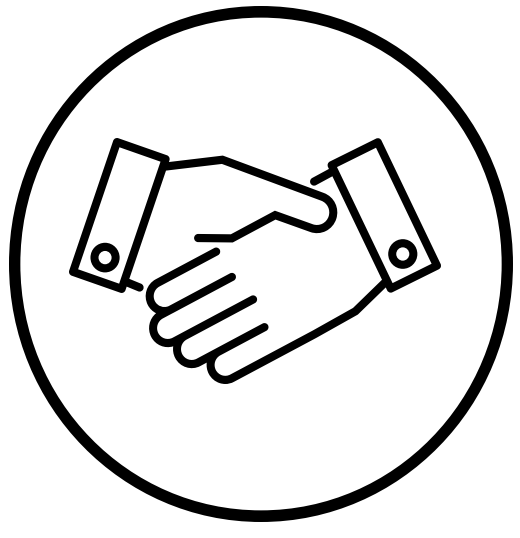
- ✓ Voted “[yes](#)” on reducing the Pentagon budget by 10%.
- ✗ Voted “[no](#)” on reducing funding for the Pentagon’s Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) account by \$16.8 billion.
- ✗ Voted “[yes](#)” on the FY 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).
- ✗ Is not a cosponsor to [H.Res.1003](#), that calls to reduce the Pentagon budget by \$350 billion.

DOMESTIC MILITARY MISUSE



- ✓ Voted “yes” on amendments that would [prohibit](#) the president from deploying troops to the southern border to enforce immigration law [and from](#) using authorized funds to detain undocumented immigrants in DoD facilities.
- ✓ Voted “yes” on an [amendment](#) to prevent DoD facilities from being used to detain unaccompanied migrant children.





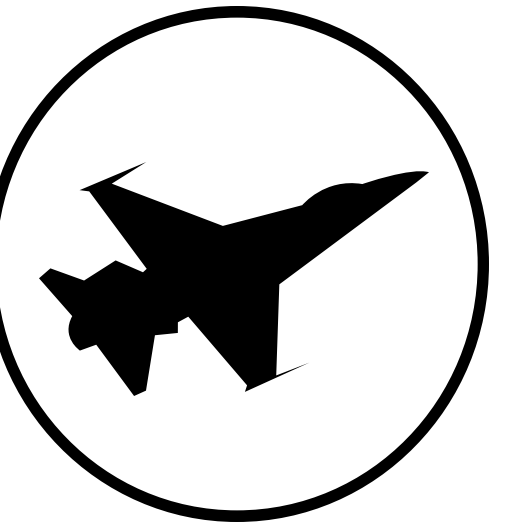
## DIPLOMACY WITH IRAN AND NORTH KOREA

- ✗ [Opposed](#) the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), known informally as the Iran deal.
- ✓ Is a cosponsor of [H.Res.152](#), a resolution that seeks to advance a peace agreement formally ending the Korean War and affirm that peace and denuclearization cannot be achieved absent reciprocal actions and confidence-building measures among all parties to the conflict.



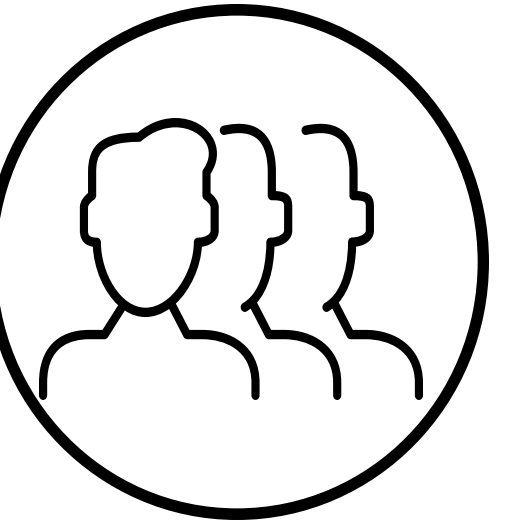
## TRADE

- ✓ Opposed the Trans-Pacific Partnership and [opposed](#) the Trade Promotion Authority (TPA), meant to “fast-track” TPP and sideline Congress from the approval process.
- ✓ [Opposed](#) the 2011 Columbia Free Trade Agreement.



## NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND ARMS CONTROL

- ✗ Voted “no” on an [amendment](#) to fence 10 percent of funds for a new Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM) program until an independent study on the cost of extending the life of the existing ICBM vs. building a new ICBM was completed.
- ✓ Voted “yes” on [amendment](#) to block funding to the W80-4 nuclear warhead life extension program until completion of a study on the unexpected cost increases in the program.
- ✓ Voted “yes” on an [amendment](#) that would prohibit funding for missiles noncompliant with the INF Treaty.
- ✓ Is a cosponsor of [H.R. 921](#), legislation to make it the policy of the United States not to use nuclear weapons first in a conflict.



## FOREIGN ASSISTANCE AND ARMS SALES

- ✓ Voted in support of an [amendment](#) to end the sale and transfer of Precision Guided Munitions to arms sales to Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, a weapon the Saudi/Emirati-led coalition has used to recklessly kill Yemeni civilians during its intervention in Yemen.
- ✗ Did not sign a House [letter](#) to Sec. of State Mike Pompeo to condemn any use of U.S.-supplied equipment to demolish Palestinian homes in the West Bank and call on the State Department to examine whether Israel’s use of U.S.-supplied equipment was in compliance with the Arms Export Control Act.
- ✗ Has [stated](#) that U.S. military aid to Israel shouldn’t be used for annexation plans.

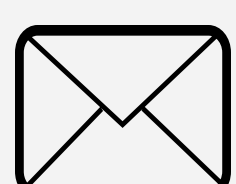
## CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

Sherman has received \$239,625 in [contributions](#) during his time in office from companies such as Northrop Grumman, Lockheed Martin, Raytheon Technologies, Parsons Corporation, and more. More than \$200,000 worth of these contributions are from PACs. Sherman has received \$548,710 in campaign contributions from “[pro-Israel groups](#)” over the course of his career. These funds have come from groups such as Desert Caucus, NorPAC, and the Washington PAC. In 2020 alone, he has received \$19,100 from the [Pro-Israel America PAC](#) and \$9,350 from [NorPAC](#). He received \$10,000 from the [Desert Caucus](#) in both 2014 and in 2020. And between 1998 and 2018, Sherman received \$27,500 from the [Washington PAC](#).
