



# ON THE ISSUES

### **ENDING ENDLESS WAR**

✓ Voted for amendments to <u>repeal</u> the 2002 AUMF and to <u>express</u> the Sense of the Congress that the 2001 AUMF has been overused, should include a sunset clause, and must define targets in its reauthorization or replacement.



- Voted for an <u>amendment</u> to eliminate indefinite military detention of any person detained under AUMF authority in the U.S., its territories, or its possessions.
- X Supported the <u>reauthorization</u> of the USA FREEDOM Act.
- Voted to <u>completely end</u> U.S. military assistance to the Saudi-led coalition's intervention in Yemen, voting against a <u>carve-out</u> for certain types of support, including intelligence-sharing and targeting assistance.
- Voted for <u>S.J.Res. 68</u>, to prohibit unauthorized military force against Iran.
- Voted for an <u>amendment</u> to withdraw all U.S. forces and military personnel from Afghanistan by April 29, 2021.
- Is not a cosponsor of <u>H.R. 1274</u>, to sunset the 2001 AUMF within eight months or <u>H.R. 2456</u>, to immediately repeal the 2002 AUMF.
- ✓ Voted against the <u>2002 AUMF</u>, to authorize the U.S. invasion of Iraq.

### **PENTAGON SPENDING**



- Voted "yes" on reducing the Pentagon budget by 10%.
- Voted "yes" on reducing funding for the Pentagon's Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) account by \$16.8 billion.
- X Voted "yes" on the FY 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA).
- $\times$  Is not a cosponsor of <u>H.Res.1003</u>, which calls to reduce the Pentagon budget by \$350 billion and use those funds to increase diplomatic capacity and domestic programs that provide true safety and security.




#### DOMESTIC MILITARY MISUSE

- Voted "yes" on amendments that would <u>prohibit</u> the president from deploying troops to the southern border to enforce immigration law <u>and from</u> using authorized funds to detain undocumented immigrants in DoD facilities.
- Voted "yes" on an <u>amendment</u> to prevent DoD facilities from being used to detain unaccompanied migrant children.



# DIPLOMACY WITH IRAN AND NORTH KOREA




- Voted to <u>support</u> the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), known informally as the Iran nuclear deal.
- ✓ Is a cosponsor of <u>H.Res.152</u>, a resolution that seeks to advance a peace agreement formally ending the Korean War and affirm that peace and denuclearization cannot be achieved absent reciprocal actions and confidence-building measures among all parties to the conflict.



### **TRADE**


- X Supported the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) and <u>supported</u> the Trade Promotion Authority (TPA), meant to "fast-track" TPP and sideline Congress from the approval process.
- X <u>Supported</u> the Colombia Free Trade Agreement.

## **NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND ARMS CONTROL**



- Voted "yes" on an <u>amendment</u> to fence 10 percent of funds for a new Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM) program until an independent study on the cost of extending the life of the existing ICBM vs. building a new ICBM was completed.
- Voted "yes" on an <u>amendment</u> to block funding to the W80-4 nuclear warhead life extension program until completion of a study on the unexpected cost increases in the program.
- Voted "yes" on an <u>amendment</u> that would prohibit funding for missiles noncompliant with the INFT.
- Is not a cosponsor of <u>H.R. 921</u>, legislation to make it the policy of the United States not to use nuclear weapons first in a conflict.

#### FOREIGN ASSITANCE AND ARMS SALES



- Voted in support of an <u>amendment</u> to end the sale and transfer of Precision Guided Munitions to arms sales to Saudi Arabia and the United Arab Emirates, a weapon the Saudi/Emirati-led coalition has used to recklessly kill Yemeni civilians during its intervention in Yemen.
- Did not sign a House <u>letter</u> to Sec. of State Mike Pompeo to condemn any use of U.S.-supplied equipment to demolish Palestinian homes in the West Bank and calling on the State Department to examine whether Israel's use of U.S.-supplied equipment was in compliance with the Arms Export Control Act.
- K Flip-flopped on conditioning U.S. military aid to Israel based on annexation plans, eventually saying that the US should give aid no matter what.

# CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

Meeks' primary source of campaign contributions come from Wall Street. He has also received \$118,000 in <u>defense industry contributions</u>, solely through PAC's, throughout his congressional career from corporations such as Boeing and Lockheed Martin. In addition, Meeks has received more than \$40,000 in <u>pro-Israel contributions</u> during his career from PAC's, such as the Democratic Majority for Israel, and individuals. In 2020, Meeks' principal campaign committee, Friends for Gregory Meeks, received \$30,197 in contributions from the <u>Pro-Israel America PAC</u>.
